

Units under the URO

The University Research Office is composed of 5 units namely:

- 1. **Research Management and Capacity Building Unit** is primarily tasked to supervise researches from conceptualization to finished research papers and provide retooling services to researchers of the university.
- 2. **Research Publication and Information Communications Unit** incharge of overseeing finished research papers for their presentation and publications to TSU recognized journals or CHED accredited journals.
- 3. **Analytical Testing Laboratory- Natural Products Research Center**provides services relating to water analysis in terms of physico-chemical and microbiological analysis both for internal and external clients.
- 4. **University Research Statistical Center** was created to primarily provide statistical consultancy and related support services to researchers, students, faculty members, and even external clienteles.
- 5. **Center for Tarlaqueño Studies** serves as the principal venue of the Province of Tarlac on historical and cultural materials. The center is also responsible in the maintenance of the University Museum on Tarlac Studies.

Functions of the URO

The University Research Office (URO) was restructured by virtue of Board Resolution No. 14 series of 2020. The primary function of the URO is to oversee, coordinate, consolidate, and operationalize the conduct of research activities along the priority areas of the University. The following are the specific functions of the Office:

- 1. To set the research targets of the university;
- 2. To assist in the conduct of research colloquium of the different colleges and offices of the university including the evaluation of research proposals in the college level;
- 3. To provide opportunities and funding support to faculty researchers of the university in pursuing research projects that are relevant to the thrusts and needs of the university;
- 4. To establish linkages between public and private agencies, for the purpose of identifying relevant subjects or problems for research, pursue research endeavors on areas of common concern jointly with these agencies;
- 5. To coordinate and monitor research projects of the various colleges and units of the university;
- 6. To formulate and implement research policies and guidelines;
- 7. To aid in the dissemination of research outputs through research publication, research presentations, workshops, roundtable discussions, workshops, and newsletters; and
- 8. To plan and implement programs directed toward the continuing development of skills and competencies of research office personnel.

Setting the research targets of the university The University Research Agenda

Through the efforts of the University Research Office and the TSU Administration, the research agenda of the university was revisited last November 2020. From the 10-point research agenda, it was compressed into 5-point research agenda. The university's newly crafted research agenda (Figure 2) was approved by the Board of Regents in December 2020 by virtue of Board Resolution No. 88 series of 2020.

The goal of the survey is to determine the needs and priorities of the university's stakeholders in terms of research and extension services and incorporate these needs and priorities to the research and extension agenda of the university for 2021 to 2023. 






Figure 3. Sample Photos Taken During the Coffee and Collaboration: TSU Research and Extension Agenda Presentation to Stakeholders

Assistance in the conduct of research colloquium of the different colleges and offices of the university including the evaluation of research proposals in the college level

This year, the URO organized and held a university- wide research proposal colloquium, instead of having it done per college like the usual practice. The colloquium, with the theme "Innovative Researches in Response to the Needs of the Community", was held on July 29- 30, 2021 wherein faculty members from difference college presented their research proposals. A total of 36 research proposals was presented in the colloquium. The office invited 2 external evaluators (1 for ABLESS and 1 for STEM) who are both experts in their fields. Dr. Bon Adrian Santiago, the Director of the Research Development, and Innovation Center of Our Lady of Fatima University evaluated ABLESS research proposals. On the other hand, Dr. Ryan John De Lara, the Director of the Research Development and Productivity Office of the Wesleyan University- Philippines evaluated the STEM research proposals. 



The University is consistent to establish collaborative ventures with research- oriented agencies and institutions. To establish research collaborations, it is important to showcase the researches produced by the faculty researchers. In order to disseminate the researches, a coffee and collaboration was organized. On April 14, 2021, the University Research Office (URO) and Extension Services Management Office (ESMO) have organized and conducted an online activity "Coffee and Collaboration: Research and Extension Agenda Presentation to the Stakeholders". The URO and ESMO have sent invitation letters addressed to the head of offices of government agencies, organizations as well as State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) in the Tarlac and Region III to participate in the presentation of research and extension agenda. Aside from external stakeholders, the URO and ESMO have also invited college deans and representatives to attend the activity. The goal of the activity is to introduce the University's research and extension agenda and the identified priority programs to the government and non-government agencies/organizations in Tarlac Province and in Region III. The activity also provided a venue where the different colleges of the university have presented and showcased their research and extension capabilities and programs to the university stakeholders. Training on Report Preparation and Data Visualization






